Why We Ride

Analyses of cancer therapeutic trials found that only 4%-6% of trial participants are Black and 3%-6% are Hispanic, despite representing 15% and 13% of people with cancer, respectively.

Data shows variable representation of racial and ethnic minorities across therapeutic areas at U.S. sites. Asians and American Indian or Alaska Natives were consistently underrepresented while Hispanic or Latino participation across most therapeutic areas fell below U.S. census estimates.

Research from the Tufts Center for the Study of Drug Development is the first to find that study sites with diverse personnel do a better job of recruiting volunteers from underrepresented groups.

2024 By The Numbers
