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Expectations for All Chapter Leaders

Governance

- Know and understand the purpose of the chapter bylaws
- Know and understand the purpose of the chapter affiliation agreement

Planning

- Be present and engaged in chapter board meetings
- Participate in setting goals and carrying out plans for your specific area (organizational goals)
- Develop specific area objectives for the year (maintenance goals)

Budgeting

- Develop a specific annual budget
- Operate responsibility within that budget
- Track and report during meetings



Chapter Affiliation Agreements

- Documents the relationship between ACRP and the chapter
- Spells out the legal use of the ACRP name, logo, and acronyms
- A copy of each chapter affiliation agreement is available at ACRP; contact your Lisa-Marie





Chapter Bylaws

- A copy of each chapters bylaws is available at ACRP; contact Lisa-Marie (lgardner@acrpnet.org)
- Chapter bylaws should be reviewed annually.
- Revisions must be sent to Lisa-Marie (<u>lgardner@acrpnet.org</u>) for review and ACRP approval
- Any bylaws changes <u>must</u> be approved by ACRP before the chapter members vote (ratify)

Chapter Affiliation Standards & Expectations (CASE)

- Minimum set of standards (within affiliation agreements)
- Submitted annually by January 31
- Chapters rewarded with ACRP funding based on membership recruitment and retention activities of the previous year.
- Templates, resources, workbook and FAQs available on the Chapter Resources Center (CRC)

Chapter Affiliation Standards & Expectations (CASE)

- 1. The chapter ensured all chapter members are both global and chapter members.
- 2. The chapter maintained a minimum of 25 members throughout the year.
- 3. The chapter provided at least two (2) professional development activities per year for members.
- 4. The Chapter Chair attended every Chapter Chairs teleconference, or designated another representative to attend.
- 5. The chapter maintained a current website with up-to-date information. (updates at least quarterly)
- 6. The chapter complied with federal and state reporting requirements.
